### **Fund-raising Presentation:**

Amy Koenen, Ezy Peezy Fundraising. New local business.

- An easier way to fundraise. Fresh and frozen food in bulk. Supplier is Gordon Food Services.
- 2 week on line campaign and then delivery to the school for parent pick up.
- No PAC man-hours or volunteering, we would be responsible for promoting the campaign but the company does the rest.
- Price point is a little high as you are buying in bulk ie. \$83 for 10lb of bacon, \$42 box of chicken. Broken down it is a good price but there may be some sticker shock.
- As the first order and first for the new business we will receive 30% of sales and 20% on any future campaigns.
- Can run multiple campaigns a year, short turn around for product, something other than the typical chocolate fundraiser. Stock up for Christmas without driving to Costco.
- **Motion Passed** to go with Ezy Peezy. Campaign will run October 29-November 9 with delivery/pick up November 14.

### **Principals Report:**

### **Gaming:**

- Dollar amount per student has gone up to \$24 per student, \$10,656. Amount based on previous years numbers.
- Cannot be spent on curriculum. Pisces Pottery from Rossland coming in January. Majority of classes have signed up. PAC to provide \$2000
- \$350 provided per class last year, some funds left over, recommended \$250 for this year with some funds going to the playground. Playground components would have to be purchased as gaming funds can't go into the playground account. Also this would help offset the 10% increase due to the steel and aluminum tariffs.

**Motion Passed,** Gaming budget as presented.

### **Elections:**

**Playground:**

- Will have to pare down design or pre purchase some components to off set the 10% increase due to tariffs.
- Catherine family to donate time and equipment to do site prep. Potential savings of 25,000. Will still have union rep/supervisor on site, but they are OK with third party contribution.

**Surplus:**

- Approximately \$350,000. Available for one time spending.
- Wendy has asked the teachers for wish lists. Technology, chrome books, ipads, alternative seating, sensory tools, digital cameras, wood and metal work tools. Pac suggested team uniforms/t-shirts.

**BCCPAC:**

- Renew membership for this year? Cost \$75. It is a valuable resource and gives access to resource materials.

**Motion passed** to renew, cheque to go out.

**TR Scholarship:**

- Anne P collects and recycles juice boxes and awards the funds to a SH student. Students apply by writing and essay on what they do to be environmentally friendly. Last year Anne raised \$100 and the PAC contributed \$150
